1. 2024'S SUSTAINABLE ACHIEVEMENTS





Organic Garden

To offer the best flavor in every dish and to reduce our carbon footprint, we produce our own organic vegetables on our land at La Sultana Oualidia. In 2024, we produced 4850 kg of vegetables and herbs representing 49% of our needs (in comparison with 4 637 kg in 2023). We produced large quantities of zucchinis, carrots, lettuces, tomatoes, and a wide variety of crops with over 50 references grown in the garden.

Cultural celebrations & Nature protection

When staying at La Sultana, each guest receives a complimentary Architectural Heritage tour in Marrakech and an Introduction to local Flora & Fauna in Oualidia. It gives our guests the keys to embark upon a journey of initiation to the Morocco of today. Through a wide range of experiences, guests are understanding the country they visit and learn from their journey. We are very proud to have taught Moroccan cuisine tricks to 616 cooks in progress and to have guided over 34 guests to a private bird watching safari in the lagoon.

Living Architecture Heritage as an audio journey

In 2025, our *Living Architectural Heritage tour* is now available in audio format for guests wishing to discover and learn about the Moroccan Architecture. The soundtrack is a journey in itself, taking you from the intimacy of the Riad to the incredible views from the rooftop terrace. Moroccan cultural heritage has never been so easy to uncover.

2. CARBON FOOTPRINT SUMMARY




Carbon Footprint

In 2024, our total carbon footprint was $1,098 \text{ TCO}_2$, a slight decrease from $1,130 \text{ TCO}_2$ in 2023. However, due to a lower occupancy and strong performance in other areas like restaurants and the Spa, emissions per room night increased. Compared to last year, per room-night emissions rose by almost 10%, reaching 94 kgCO₂ in Marrakech and 231 kgCO₂ in Oualidia. The management of our carbon footprint is a key component of our commitment. We collect and report data on all our properties' activities and equipment that emit greenhouse gases.

Per room-night comparisons

Another useful approach for comparing the carbon footprints of each property is to interpret the emissions through a measure of 'per-unit' emissions such as per occupied rooms. This is defined as:

Total carbon footprint Total occupied rooms

In 2024, the carbon footprint per occupied room of La Sultana Marrakech was 94KgCo2 and 231KgCo2 at La Sultana Oualidia, compared respectively to 87kg and 204kg in 2023. On a 'per room-night' basis, emissions were up 10% compared to last year which can be explain by increased activity in areas such as restaurants and the Spa.

La Sultana Oualidia records higher per room-night emissions (231 kgCO₂) compared to La Sultana Marrakech (94 kgCO₂), largely due to its remote location requiring on-site seawater desalination, as well as its unique configuration – a small number of rooms (12) relative to its extensive facilities, including three restaurants and a spa.

Water

La Sultana Marrakech used 7,500 cubic meters of water in 2024. At the same time, La Sultana Oualidia utilizes solely desalinated sea water which is, once used, 100% recycled below ground and as such the impact of this natural resource is nil.

Creation of a Positive Impact for La Sultana

We have converted our CO2 emissions to a Dirham value using a conversion factor of MAD350 per ton of CO2¹. We pledge to allocate 50% of our carbon emissions evaluation to a Positive Impact fund to finance earth-friendly projects and charities. Our financial contribution fosters activities that have positive impacts for Moroccan people and communities.

In 2024, our initial budget for our Positive Impact fund represents 192 000 MAD (50% of 1098t *350 MAD). We have exceeded our expenses to reach 226 650 MAD spent on regenerative projects and financial contributions (+34 650 MAD compared to our initial commitment).

The cost of 350 MAD per ton of carbon emissions, in line with yearly report on carbon credit pricing, is used to better understand the impact of our operations and incentivize low carbon innovations within each property, cutting our company 's energy use and carbon pollution. Beach clean-ups

La Sultana invests in the natural reserve of Oualidia, working on the protection of birds and on cleaning of the shores. As well as the daily clean-up near the property, each year, the whole team allocates one full day to clean the lagoon. This represents a budget of MAD 30 000 in wages & equipment to make a significant impact for the natural reserve and the population of Oualidia. Thanks to the team efforts, we collected 4,7 tons of trash in 2024.
